<u>A</u>rtificial <u>I</u>ntelligence (AI) – I am not a fan. AI tries to finish my sentences, to tell me what it suspects are my intentions and nudges its way into my life by supposing it knows my interests and needs.

Perhaps you have seen AI created pictures that show up on Facebook to "oh how cute", "how wonderful", "how very WOW worthy" comments and enough vs to make a person wonder how anyone could fall for such an obviously fake picture. It's laughable.

Except that it is not all that funny! At a time when truth seems hard to come by, AI swoops in the create even more confusion. AI software creates "informational" articles using sources found on the web – sources that can be filled with untruth. People begin to accept anything they read as fact. People not only believe the lie, but pass it on to others.

So, what can we know as true and real? What is the intelligence we can believe? The Gospel of John is filled with verses containing the word "truth". Starting early on in chapter 1: 14 we read, "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth". Jesus calls himself the way, the truth and the life. (John 14:6). Jesus' promises us that we will know the truth and the truth will set us free (John 8:32). God's truth and grace comes to us in the means of grace (the Word and the Sacraments). Paul would later explain to the church in Corinth that In Christ Jesus, true wisdom is found - "And because of him you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, righteousness and sanctification and redemption," (1 Corinthians 1:30) That wisdom from God is not artificial intelligence – It's the real deal – and it is given freely to you in Word and Sacrament. Take in His Truth which is "able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus". (2 Timothy 3:15)


