He Loves Me

He Loves Me, He Loves Me, He Loves Me!

Yesterday I received an awesome early birthday card. In one sentence it reminded me of three of my favorite Bible verses. It



is a Dayspring card which says, "On your birthday, relax and savor God's unchanging love for you, the delight He takes in you, and the good plans He has for you." I want to share my love for these verses and what they mean to me. Please let the verses speak to you, too.

The first of these verses that I was aware of was Jeremiah 29:11, For I know the plans I have for you, declares

the LORD, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope (NIV). God knows our futures and the decisions we need to make. When the options are before us, sometimes the right choice is not obvious. The difference in possible outcomes is unclear and unknown. It's then that we need to ask God for guidance. The direction might be found in a Bible verse, a word from

the pulpit, or someone else's comment in a conversation. When we have asked for guidance, we must be ready to receive the message!

I don't remember when I came across Zephaniah 3:17. It tells me that I am loved as a true daughter of the king. The LORD your God ... will rejoice over you with gladness; he will quiet you by his love; he will exult over you with loud

singing.

Can you imagine your dad writing a song about you and singing it out loud for all to hear, declaring his love and pride in you to everyone who can hear his voice? Does it make your heart almost burst?

The third of these verses is the first one mentioned on the card and has become my all-time favorite. It is found in Isaiah 54:10. Verse 9 leads into it by saying this is a promise like the one God gave to Noah with the rainbow in the sky. "Though the mountains be shaken and the hills be removed, yet my unfailing love for you will not be shaken nor my covenant of peace be removed," says the LORD, who has compassion on you.

I discovered this verse when I was feeling extremely guilty, and its implication is that my guilt will never change God's love for me. All the weight of my guilt fell from my shoulders when I comprehended that verse. What a

There are so many other Bible verses that affirm God's love for each of us:

- † For God so loved the world (John 3:16)
- † Surely I am with you always (Matthew 28:20)
- † How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! (1 John 3:1)
- † He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. (1 John 4:9)

And even the song we sang as children, "Jesus loves me, this I know, for the Bible tells

ne so."

Rejoice that you are His. Rejoice that His love for you is unfailing. Rejoice that He has given you gifts to use in His kingdom. Use those gifts to follow His plan and to honor Him by serving others.

It has been an honor to serve as your leader these last four years. I pray that God will guide me and each of you on the right paths in the time ahead. God be with each of you!

Have you ever wondered if you said "yes" to the wrong thing, or have said too many things? About five years ago


I responded, "yes," when asked if I would consider serving as Pastoral Counselor for the LWML Ohio District

promises!


When faced with a yes

Thank you for the opportunity to serve alongside you these past four years. I am glad I said yes to serving. I only pray my contributions towards the




