Having seen my husband of 60 years suffer three life-threatening illnesses and numerous other health concerns over the past five years, I strongly believe God saved him. The fact that he is still alive and doing well has been commented upon by doctors, nurses, and friends more than once. We survived each crisis thanks to the prayers of pastors, friends, and family.

The fear was overwhelming; I had no idea how to deal with it, so I prayed. In prayer, I asked God to help me cope, to be strong, and to shield me from tears, fears, and pain. He did.

Despite this, doubt is always lurking in the back of my mind, doubting the prayers will have any effect. Many times, when thinking about the role of Ohio District President, I struggled with doubt, wondering whether I was good enough, worthy, capable, and too old at the age of 78 to serve. Am I still relevant? Will the daily aches and pains I have impede my ability to lead? Dare I take the time away from my husband as his caregiver. Relentless doubts abounded. When I was ready to give up and guit God, the church, LWML, and the thought of serving as president, God prevailed. He told me, "you can do

this," and He gave me talents for "good works created in Christ Jesus." I couldn't ignore Him, so I accepted the nomination of LWML Ohio District President.

In serving as your President, I offer you the talents God has blessed me with. The LWML Ohio District mission is "to assist each woman in affirming her relationship with the Triune God so that she is enabled to use her gifts in ministry to the people of the world." With a strong belief in God and the miracles He has provided, I willingly accept the challenges of the position, asking God to help us find ways to increase inclusiveness, and to use

creativity to spread the joy of helping all of us find ways to continue the mission of the LWML Ohio District.

He is our shield and our strength, shielding us from the swirling doubts, and giving us strength to move forward. As President, one of the greatest challenges I embrace is to help every woman believe in the power of the Lord. We are God's

treasures and He is our shield and our strength. He loves our individuality, and our unique talents, which He gave us to *Serve the Lord with Gladness!* (Psalm 100:1)

As President, "I" is really "we and us" not just me. We can accomplish anything. Thank you for giving me the honor to serve you in the 31st Biennium of the LWML Ohio District. I pray that God gives me the wisdom to understand His will and direction.

So I asked Your disciples to cast it out, and they were not able. Mark 9:18b

Have you ever been in a situation where you weren't able to do what you needed to do? It is humiliating to fail. It's even worse when people point and laugh. However, the worst thing is when you can't help someone you love when they need you.

This has actually happened several times!
Right after Jesus' transfiguration. He came down the mountain to find His disciples arguing and complaining in the middle of a crowd. What a moodbreaker that must have been! A man with a demonpossessed child is thrown forth by the crowd when Jesus asks what's going on; when he brought his son to the disciples to be healed, they were not able to cast out the evil spirit from him. What an embarrassing and unexpected experience for the disciples! With the power Jesus had given them, they had cast out evil spirits before (Mark 6:13). The situation had worsened when some scribes showed up and began arguing with them.

Jesus is exasperated. "O faithless generation, how long am I to be with you? How long am I to bear with you? Bring him to Me". It is clear that he is disappointed in someone. Perhaps the scribes and crowd as well.


Suddenly, the boy's father makes a mistake: "If you can help us, please have compassion on us."

Whoops! Faithless again. When Jesus gently confronts him on it, the man immediately reverses course, saying, "I believe; help my unbelief".

Jesus then addresses the demon. 'Come out,' he commands. In the end, it does, though not without a final seizure, and the child appears to be dead. However, he is not. All is well again when Jesus returns the boy to his father. Mark 9:19-29.

This story is full of failures. Despite the disciples' efforts, the crowd is blamed for their lack of faith; the father portrays a similar lack of faith; even Jesus fails for a moment when the child appears dead. It's a mess! It doesn't look like a triumphant victory. Nevertheless, that's what it is. Through these people, God has set a child free from the power of evil. Despite their worst mistakes, God was still able to save them.

Isn't this true for us, too? We make mistakes all the time. It's rare that we are able to perform any act of Christian service with the magnificent grace we wish we had. We trip, fall, and crawl our way to victory. We crawl to Jesus, who turns our defeat into a blessing we could never have imagined.

It was a joy to see the young women who represented their zones. We had a very inspiring Bible study leader, keynote speaker and mission grant speaker. Later, our keynote speaker Rev. Kris Wittby came back up on stage to make us laugh and lighten up our

hearts. He also provided a message about "Serving the Lord with Gladness" that holds up no matter where in the world you are from. We cast our votes and have elected a president, other officers and new mission grants to bless with our mites. We have so much to be thankful for.

I would like to recap and give the final numbers for the servant events and Gifts from the Heart. There were three servant events Friday morning. The first group made 20 Braille books for Lutheran Braille Workers. The second group assembled sanitary kits for The Heart of Ohio Diaper Bank. The ladies packed 78 pad and 68 tampon kits.

You surprised our hostess from Heart of Ohio with your willingness and eagerness to prepare. You showed up to write 136 cards of encouragement

to pastors in the Ohio District. We used many of the items donated to make additional kits. Many of you blessed the diaper bank with cute and inspirational notes to pack with the diaper kits.

The third group wrote messages for seminary students. Eighty-eight students will receive an encouraging card. This group finished writing to all the seminary students before they began writing to the pastors of the Ohio District.

We also had a servant event during interest session on Friday afternoon. Several women showed up to write cards of encouragement to pastors in the Ohio District. In total 136 cards were written to pastors.

We blessed three organizations with our Gifts from the Heart. All together we collected 575 food items for the Akron Canton Regional Food Bank, Jeff Summers from the food bank said that they weighed the items and it was 555 pounds of food equal to 962.5 meals. They also received a \$125 donation. For the Heart of Ohio Diaper Bank we received 159 packages of diapers, 208 packages of period products and an additional \$125 was donated. For Hope Rising we collected 13 canisters of baby formula and 109 bottles of baby wash and lotion. They also received a \$165 donation. All three organizations sent thank you notes and messages, thanking the LWML for our servant hearts and generosity.

Mission Grants Selected at Ohio District Convention

The Mission Grant Committee shared information about 13 mission grant applicants with a PowerPoint presentation on Saturday morning of the 2024 LWML Ohio District Convention.

The convention delegates had a difficult task to select those applicants that will receive an LWML Ohio District grant this biennium. All 13 mission grant applicants play an important role in the mission field, bringing the grace and mercy of Christ to many. Following is the priority listing of the grants that the LWML Ohio District will be funding this biennium.

- Military Veterans & Family Member Counseling, Care Programs & Services – Lutheran Military Veterans & Families Ministries, Fort Wayne, IN - \$10,000
- 2. Support for Seminarians Ohio District LCMS Student Financial Aid Committee \$15,000
- 3. Concordia Theological Seminary Food Co-Op – Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, IN - \$12,000
- 4. Comfort Dog Ministry Atonement Lutheran Church, Columbus -\$7,000
- 5. Ministry Outreach to Muslims of Greater Columbus POBLO International \$12,000
- 6. Code Blue 24/7 Extended Hours for Extreme Weather Project Hope for the Homeless Lake County Ohio \$8,000
- 7. Orphan Grain Train Ohio Division \$7,000
- 8. Support for LCMS Church Worker Students - Ohio District LCMS Student Financial Aid Committee -\$12,000
- 9. Christ-Centered Curriculum -Bethlehem Lutheran School, Fairborn OH - \$10,000
- Position Cost of New Missionaries in Cincinnati OH - POBLO International - \$2,000 (partial funding)

Regretfully, the three grant applicants not receiving LWML Ohio District funding this biennium are the Lutheran Heritage Foundation, the Lutheran Braille Workers, and St. Paul's Lutheran Church.

With fewer mite contributions last biennium, we only had \$95,000 available to fund missions for this biennium.

Please consider increasing your mite contributions and encourage others to do the same.




Convention Wrap-up


